To culminate this incredible month, we held an Celebration Assembly, where each class shared their findings and celebrated their chosen figurehead. The presentations included art, drama, poetry, and other creative projects, showcasing the children's hard work and creativity.

CURRICULUM WORKSHOPS

LIVERPOOL SCHOOLS PARLIAMENT



On Wednesday, 13th November, our School Officers attended the Liverpool Schools Parliament* at the LACE Conference Centre, where they joined other schools to discuss children's rights in preparation for 'World Children's Day' the following week.

The session, focused on the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC), and provided an opportunity for children to share their views on important topics such as:

- Which rights are most important in their lives and why.
- Rights they didn't know they had.
- Rights they believe should be added.
- How these rights affect children in other countries whose lives differ from their own.

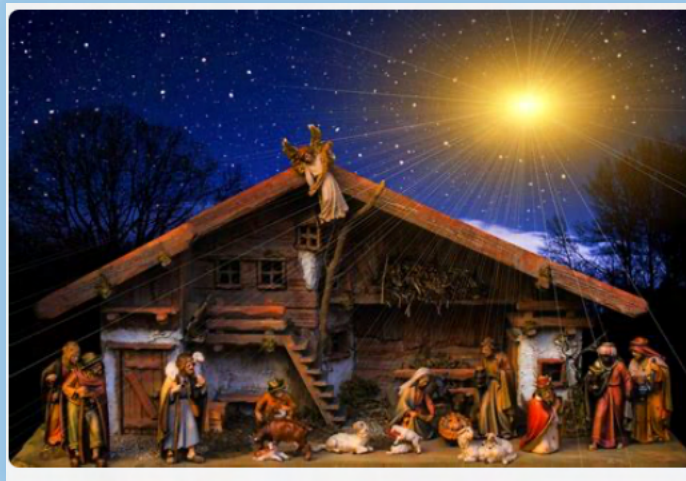
BREAKFAST WITH SANTA - COMING SOON

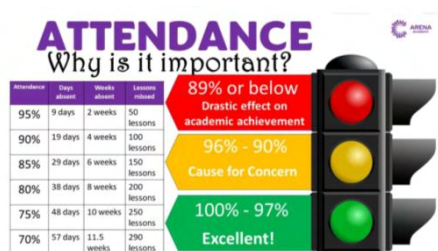


Potato Heads: Our Attendance Reward System
